# From the pastor...

Wednesday is the Feast of St. Casimir, patron of Poland and Lithuania. March 4th falls quite often in Lent.

A few years ago, St. Patrick's Day fell on a Friday of Lent. The bishop decided not to give a general dispensation from the Friday abstinence, which upset a lot of folk who intended to celebrate with corned beef and cabbage.

The Sunday after Easter that year, the bishop came to St. Mary Magdalene to celebrate confirmation. At lunch, I gently teased the bishop about his decision. He reacted in good humor, and told me that when St. Casimir's day fell on a Friday of Lent he would dispense me from abstinence. I retorted that, being a vegetarian, such a dispensation would do me little good, and asked instead that he dispense the whole parish. He agreed.

Recently, I decided to figure out what might be the year when St. Casimir's day fell on a Friday of Lent. I discovered that it would be far beyond my expected life time, and presumably the bishop lifetime also. I suspect the bishop knew that when he made the offer!
