FROM THE PASTOR...

A huge thank-you to all those who worked so hard for our festival! The work begins with making overall plans and strategies throughout the past year. Of course, it becomes more intense in the weeks and even months preceding the festival, taking care of the many details that may not be obvious: (like working out menus, shopping for, ordering and transporting food, setting up cooking facilities, ordering food tickets, contracting for tents, tables, and chairs, ordering fire extinguishers, portable sanitary facilities, obtaining city permits, mailing raffle tickets to school and parish families, soliciting prizes, updating yard signs, designing, printing, and distributing window signs, soliciting sponsor contributions, purchasing and preparing supplies for funnel cakes, snow cones, etc., ordering and transporting pop, bottled water, stringing lights and electric cables, setting up tables and chairs, setting up the cake wheel, grocery wheel, funnel cake, children's games booths and equipment, contracting with entertainers). All of this work needs to be done before the Festival even opens!

The thirteen booth chairs are the heart of a smooth running Festival. They plan and manage the many activities that make up the Festival, adjusting to last minute exigencies and volunteer staffing. More than 118 parish and school volunteers worked at least 189 festival shifts. In addition, at least 11 people worked set up and 17 people worked tear down, with the help of scouts and explorers.

The parish employees, too, take on a huge burden before, during, and after the Festival, including office staff and custodial staff. And of course uncounted people baked cakes, prepared and donated grocery baskets, and sold raffle tickets.

The Festival ran smoothly, with no significant problems (except thunderstorms). Virtually all the workers I talked to, had fun and enjoyed working with other parish and school family members. This is the great success of our Festival, along with the contact it enables us to make with our neighbors. And this success is not diminished by any impact that bad weather may have on the financial outcomes of our efforts.
