From the pastor...

Monday, we celebrate the Solemnity of St. Peter and St. Paul, considered the founders of the Holy Roman Catholic Church. On this day, newly created metropolitan archbishops travel to Rome to receive the sign of their office (the pallium) from the hand of the Holy Father. The pallium is the circular band worn on the shoulders with a single lappet or tail hanging in the front and in the back; thus, resembling from either viewpoint, the letter "Y." It is made of wool cloth, woven from sheep, blessed and presented to the Pope on the Feast of St. Agnes at the Church of St. Agnes on the Piazza Navonna in Rome. The pallia of archbishops are mostly white with six small black crosses, while the crosses on the pallium of the Pope are red. In some parts of the world (e.g.: England, Scotland, and Wales), the Solemnity of St. Pater and St. Paul is a holy day of obligation, but of course not so in the United States. In the Archdiocese of Paris, it is the day on which priests are ordained.

RCIA – The Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) is a process where interested non-Catholics are introduced to the teachings and traditions of the Catholic Faith. Sessions will begin September 13. For more information, please contact Cindy Oddi at 614-551-0338 or coddi@saintmarymag.org.
