From the pastor...

Tuesday is the feast of St. Jean-Baptiste-Marie Vianney, the patron saint of parish priests. He was an unlikely candidate for ordination, a very slow scholar and a deserter from Napoleon's army. He was sent home from major seminary, but his pastor convinced the vicar general of the diocese that his piety more than made up for his lack of knowledge. Three years after his ordination he was made pastor of Ars, a town of 230 inhabitants. He was a stern and puritanical preacher who led an abstemious life style, trying on four different occasions to abandon parish ministry for the monastery. Evidently, he was a compassionate and perceptive confessor. As many as 20,000 people from all over Europe made pilgrimage to Ars in each of the saint's last years. He remained in the confessional for 12 hours a day in winter and 18 hours a day in summer. He reported violent bouts with the devil because of his success in bringing back souls to Christ. He died at the age of only 73 in 1859 and his body remains incorrupt, entombed above the main altar of the basilica in Ars. Please pray for parish priests.

Mentorship Opportunity Homeport of Ohio, in conjunction with the St Vincent de Paul Society (SVDP), First Church of God and Columbus Mortgage Bankers Association is seeking volunteer mentors for a school-year program mentoring 5th to 8th grade youth who live in the Emerald Glen Apartment Community and attend Southwest City Schools. Emerald Glen Apartment Community is located off of Hall Road, between Georgesville Road and Norton Road, just west of I-270 in southwest Columbus.
