**The sacred remains of Saint Maria Goretti, Patroness of Virtue and of Mercy,** will be at Saint Joseph Cathedral on October 21, from 11:00 a.m.-11:00 p.m., with a special Memorial Mass celebrated at 7:00 p.m. This is a first-of-a-kind visit of her remains to the United States and is coordinated with the Holy See's Congregation for the Causes of Saints and the Treasures of the Church, and is part of a national Pilgrimage of Mercy in preparation for the Extraordinary Year of Mercy, which officially begins on December 8.
