Our Diocesan Family Rosary Day will be celebrated this year at 3:00 p.m., Sunday, October 11, at St. Joseph Cathedral. This liturgy, which is presided over by Bishop Frederick F. Campbell, is a wonderful opportunity to enjoy community, worship God, and ask our Blessed Mother's intercessions for the needs of God's people. All are welcome.

The Sisters of St. Francis of Mary Immaculate were founded in Joliet, Illinois, in 1865, 150 years ago this year. Ten years later, the congregation came to teach in the Columbus Diocese at Saint Mary Parish, Columbus, and later at Corpus Christi, Immaculate Conception, Saint Mary Magdalene, Saint Cecilia, and Saint Michael Parishes in addition teaching at Bishop Ready High School. The Sisters also helped to begin Saint Stephen School and to staff Our Lady of Mercy School in Granville. On October 11, the Sisters will celebrate the 150th Anniversary of their founding. All are invited to attend the Mass at Saint Mary Church, 672 South Third Street, at 3:00 p.m. A reception will follow in the school gymnasium at St. Mary.

A special Mass to celebrate the contribution of men and women religious within our Diocese will be held on Thursday, October 15, at St. Paul the Apostle Parish, 313 North State Street, Westerville, at 7:00 p.m. Mass will be celebrated by Bishop Frederick F. Campbell, followed by a reception and women's Vocation Fair for young women in the Parish's Activity Center. All are invited to attend.
