From the pastor...

The Feast of Christ the King (next Sunday) was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925, to fall on the Sunday before the All Saints day, and thusly the last Sunday in October (incidentally Reformation Sunday). The feast was created in the context of the unification of the different states on the Italian peninsula into one Kingdom of Italy. On September 20, 1870, after Napoleon III withdrew from Rome to fight in the Franco-Prussian War, Rome was captured by the forces of King Victor Emanuel II, making it the capital of the Kingdom. Of course, Popes did not recognize the legitimacy of Italian sovereignty over the Papal States, and the question ("the Roman Question") remained open for some 59 years, until the creation of the Vatican City State by the Lateran Pacts of 1929. The creation of the feast of Christ the King intimated that it was Christ (and his vicar the Pope) who rightfully ruled Rome and not the King of Italy.

In different times some forty years later, Pope Paul VI changed the title of the Feast to "Our Lord Jesus Christ King of the Universe" and changed the date of the celebration to the last Sunday of the church year. With these changes and in the spirit of the times just after the Second Vatican Council, the celebration was adopted by the Church of England and the Episcopal Church as well as the Anglican Church in North America, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America and other Lutheran bodies, the United Methodist Church and other Methodist bodies, the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), the United Church of Christ, and the Moravian Church, all churches that used the Common Lectionary.

The encyclical that established the feast (Quas Primas), said that if Christ is truly king, he must reign in our minds, wills, hearts, and bodies.
