From the pastor...

Normally the Solemn Feast of the Annunciation falls on March 25, nine months before the nativity of Jesus. However, this year that was Good Friday, so the annunciation has been moved to the first "open" date: this coming Monday.

The feast is very ancient, the first mention of it being in the year 656 at the Council of Toledo, where it is described as widely celebrated. It was celebrated as the beginning of the new year in France until 1564 and in England until 1762. The Annunciation of Mary is mentioned twice in the Qur'an.

It marks the beginning event of our salvation in Christ, the conception of Jesus in Mary's womb. That is why it is traditional to genuflect at the words "was incarnate of the Virgin Mary" when the Creed is recited on the Annunciation, just like on Christmas Day. So we come full circle from the culminating event of our salvation, the death and resurrection of Jesus, back to the beginning event.
