### *From the pastor...*

Monday is my saints day: St. Stanisław of Szczepanów. Educated in Paris he was, upon his return to Poland, ordained a priest by the archbishop of Kraków, Lambert II Suła, whom he replaced when the archbishop died. St. Stanisław got into a disagreement with King Bolesław the Bold, whom he had criticized for his harsh treatment of soldiers who had deserted to protect their wives and families and for his sexual immorality. Reminiscent of Thomas Becket, St. Stanisław was murdered by order of the king in the great cathedral inside of Wawel Castle in Kraków. As a result, Bolesław was deposed, fled to Hungary, and was replaced by his brother, Władysław I Herman.

St. Stanisław was canonized in 1253 by Pope Innocent IV. In 1969, his feast day was moved from May 8 to April 11, the day of his death. St. Stanisław is the first native Polish saint, and is patron of Poland (along with St. Adalbert and Our Lady Queen of Poland). There are many fanciful legends surrounding the life and death of St. Stanisław.
