### *From the pastor...*

Monday is the Feast [memorial] of St. Dominic. He founded the Order of Preachers (Dominicans) in 1216, a few years after St. Francis founded the Order of Friars Minor (Franciscans). Both were mendicant orders, that is orders of beggars, who relied on charity for their survival. Partially in response to the growing wealth of Benedictine monasteries and partially in response (in the case of Dominic) to the lifestyle of poverty of the Cathar or Albigensian Christian heretics, the new mendicant orders lived in abject poverty. Dominic and his bishop undertook a mission to the Cathars in Spain and southern France.

The spread of the Marian rosary is attributed to the preaching of St. Dominic.

The Dominicans altered the course of intellectual history by making a well-thought-out and rational response to the new learning that was appearing as long-forgotten thinkers, such as Aristotle, became known once more in the Christian west. St. Thomas Aquinas, O.P., attempted to synthesize Aristotelian philosophy with the principles of Christianity.

St. Dominic died at the age of 51 in Bologna on August 6th, 1221, worn out by his austere life.
