From the pastor...

Once a month, we have Mass and Adoration in the chapel of Bp. Campbell Hall, the former convent chapel. If you have never seen the chapel, or haven't seen it for many years, you are especially welcome to join us. We have replaced the statues of Mary and Joseph with reproductions to match those originally installed, replaced the tabernacle that had been stored in the back sacristy of the church, added a crucifix provided by Carl Colopy, found the original altar linens and Communion vessels used by the sisters, and added pews obtained from St. Stephen the Martyr.

Mass begins at 9:00 a.m., followed by Adoration until noon, when Benediction is given with the Blessed Sacrament. To participate, you needn't stay the whole three hours. Come for Mass and stay for a bit after or stop by for a time during the morning. You might also come for a time of Adoration before noon and stay for Benediction. The morning is filled with alternating times of communal and private prayer.
