# From the pastor...

If you are about my age, you may remember a different liturgical calendar. In those days, Epiphany was technically a bigger liturgical celebration than Christmas, and was followed by the "Epiphany Season" up to six Sundays long. Some of the feasts of that season, including Holy Family, the Epiphany itself, and the Baptism of the Lord are now celebrated with reference to Christmas, and the Sundays after the Christmas season ends are called Sundays in Ordinary Time, instead of Sundays of the Epiphany.

It is our custom to welcome adults preparing for Baptism and for Reception into Full Communion with the church on the Feast of the Baptism of Lord. But since that feast was on a Monday this year, we will welcome our candidate for reception this Sunday instead. Luckily the Sunday readings still recall the Baptism of the Lord.

Because 9:00 a.m. is his usual Mass, we are welcoming Racey Morris at that Mass. Racey has been attending church at St. Mary Magdalene with his wife Julie for some years now. I know the regulars at the 9:00 a.m. Mass already know them, or at least will immediately recognize them.
