From the pastor...

This weekend, we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Trinity. I think, perhaps, this is the first feast on the Church calendar to celebrate a doctrinal dogma instead of an historic event. Of course, to say something (God) is one and, at the same time, three is a logical impossibility, at least as far as finite human logic and comprehension go. That is why we so often speak of the Holy Trinity in metaphors, like a shamrock or a triangle. One of my favorite metaphors for the relationship amongst the Persons of the Trinity is a Greek word: perichoresis. That's "peri," like in "perimeter" and "choresis," like in "choreography." In English, it means that the Persons of the Trinity dance about each other! And the wonderful part is that with our Baptism into the Body of Christ, we are invited to the dance!

The West Deanery Corpus Christi Celebration will be hosted by St. Patrick's Church, 61 South Union Street, London, on Sunday, June 18. The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed for Adoration at the conclusion of the 10:30 a.m. Mass. Opportunity for private prayer will continue until 4:00 p.m. when Evening Prayer will be sung, followed by an outdoor Procession of the Blessed Sacrament, concluding with Benediction. A light reception will follow.
