From the pastor...

A 2010 Pew Forum Study found that 46% of Catholics are aware of the Church's teaching on the Eucharist and believe in the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist. Seventeen percent of Catholics are *unaware* of the Church's teaching; yet, still believe in the real presence. Blessed are those who have not seen, yet still believe!

Among the 50% of Catholics who are aware of the Church's teaching, those who doubt the real presence number only 4% of Catholics.

The Holy Eucharist is "the source and summit of the Christian life" (Catechism 1324). It is the real, substantial presence of Christ among us: "the body and blood, together with the soul and divinity, of our Lord Jesus Christ and, therefore, *the whole Christ is truly, really, and substantially contained*" (Catechism 1374, quoting the Council of Trent).

Substantial refers to the real part of something, the essential; for example, get to the substance of the matter, rather than to the merely and mundane external aspects.

As the only begotten Son of God is consubstantial with the Father, that is, of the same essential reality [as we say in the Creed], so too, is the Eucharist of the same essential reality as the Lord Jesus Christ.

This is what we celebrate on the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ.
