Next Saturday, July 22, is the Feast of St. Mary Magdalene, our patroness. Last year, Pope Francis issued a decree elevating the memorial of St. Mary Magdalene to a feast day, a category of celebration reserved to saints of particular importance, like the twelve apostles. The decree was entitled *Apostola Apostolorum*, which means apostle of the apostles.

We will celebrate the feast day Mass at 4:00 p.m. next Saturday. Of course, it will fulfill your Sunday obligation. Afterwards, we will have an "appetizer" celebration in the church hall. Wine and cheese and other "first courses" will be served. If you would like to bring a small plate of your favorite appetizer to share, it will be appreciated, though not necessary.

We are proud to introduce ourselves as the Holy Land Carvings group from the Holy Land. We have come to the United States representing the Christian woodcarvers of Bethlehem that rely on the tourism to support their families.
