From the pastor...

Wednesday, November 1, is All Saints Day. We celebrate those who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith and who live in the peace of everlasting life in heaven. In days gone by, the souls in heaven were known as "the Church Triumphant." We ask their prayers for us that we may one day join them.

Thursday, November 2, is All Souls Day. On this day, we assist with our prayers those who have died and are completing the process of becoming perfect in purgatory so that they make join the saints in heaven. These souls were called the Church Penitent, or the Church Suffering, or the Church Expectant.

Those of us still on earth struggling against sin and the devil and "against principalities and powers, against the rulers of the world of this darkness, against the spirits of wickedness in high places" [Ephesians 6:12] were once known the Church Militant.

Notice that the souls on earth, the souls in purgatory, and the souls in heaven are all part of the Church. We refer to ourselves, all together, living and dead, as the Communion of Saints. We pray for each other as the Mystical Body of Christ. Each member contributes to the good of all and shares in the welfare of all.

November 1 is a holy day of obligation. Our Masses will be at 8:15 a.m. and 7:00 p.m.
