From the pastor...

When I was a very young child, November 11 was called Armistice Day, celebrating the end of World War I. We paused in school (public school!), to bow our heads in prayer at 11:00 a.m. on 11/11. I can remember WWI veterans selling red paper poppies on street corners that day, recalling the poem *In Flanders Fields*, written by Canadian military physician Lt. Col. John McCrae.

The name of the day was officially changed to Veterans Day in the U.S. in 1954, though it took some time to catch on. Its celebration was moved to the fourth Monday in October in 1971, but moved back to its present date in 1978. This year, since November 11 is on a weekend, we observe Veterans Day on Friday, November 10.

In this month of prayer for the dead, please take time to pray not only for veterans of the armed services, but especially for those who offered their lives, as well as for the safety of those who are serving their county in the military today.
