With the celebration of Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord, we begin Holy Week, the most important liturgical period of the whole year. If you have not yet received the Lord's forgiveness in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, we will celebrate it Monday at 7:45 a.m. and 6:30 p.m. and Tuesday at 7:45 a.m. St. Joseph Day Masses will be celebrated at 8:15 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. Monday. Lenten weekday Mass will be celebrated on Tuesday at 8:15 a.m.

The Annual Chrism Mass will be celebrated at 6:00 p.m. at St. Joseph Cathedral.

The sacred Three days begin with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday at 7:00 p.m., followed by Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament until Night Prayer at 9:00 p.m. (There is no morning Mass Holy Thursday.)

The Liturgy of the Lord's Passion (with the Adoration of the True Cross and distribution of Holy Communion will be celebrated at 7:00 p.m. on Good Friday. There is no Mass anywhere in the world on Good Friday. It is also a day of fast and abstinence from meat.

We will gather for the Easter Vigil at 8:30 p.m. Holy Saturday. There is no 4:00 Mass that day.

Easter Day Masses are at the usual times of 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. The 11:00 Mass will be sign interpreted.

Even if you have let Lent slip by this year, you still have time to get ready for Easter with these oldest and most beautiful liturgies.
