From the pastor...

Monday is Memorial Day, originally known as Decoration Day. It started after the Civil War as a way to remember fallen soldiers buried in Arlington National Cemetery. Gradually, it came to be a day to remember all the fallen soldiers of all American wars and, eventually, its name was changed from Decoration Day to Memorial Day. Though it remains a day of patriotic remembrance, its scope has broadened to the memory of all the dead, military or not.

Even though it is a secular observance, “memory” is also a theological concept, like “solidarity.” The German theologian Johann Metz tells us that memories of hurtful events can be the source of hope. For when we honor the memories of people whose lives have been cut short by wars and violence (even street violence and domestic violence), we are invited to imagine “what could have been.” And that imagination brings us to become keenly aware of “what yet might be.”
